- Students must take one course from each of the six Breadth areas (Fine & Performing Arts, Humanities, Info & Communication in Society, Life Science, Physical Science, and Social Science). No more than two courses (6 hours) can be from the same department.
- In addition to completing CJ 111 and other course prerequisites for the major, students must take CJ 202 and CJ 208 and at least one other 200 level CJ course during the two-semester pre-CJ program. They also are encouraged to join the Criminal Justice Club, and to participate in other activities that relate to the major. The pre-CJ program is waived for transfer students who have already completed the relevant courses or have received an associate's degree in criminal justice or equivalent field from a community college.
- A Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree requires completion of 6 courses in Fine & Performing Arts (BFPA/FPA) and/or Humanities (BHUM/HUM) and 2 semesters of the same foreign language. A Bachelor of Science (BS) degree requires completion of 8 lecture courses in Life Sciences (BLS/LS), Physical Sciences (BPS/PS), and/or Social Sciences (BSS/SS) including 2 with labs (EL).
- ⁵ Student must be a declared major or minor to enroll.

General Education Note:

• Students must complete one New Freshmen Seminar (NFS) course during their first 30 hours at SIUE, preferably in the 1st semester. Specific sections (i.e. FR1, F01) of courses are potential options. Please see an academic advisor for clarification.

Applications for admission to the Criminal Justice major will be reviewed by an Admissions Committee composed of the Director of Criminal Justice Studies and two members of the full-time criminal justice faculty. Admission to this program will be highly competitive and students should not assume that meeting the minimum criteria to apply for admission will guarantee their acceptance into the program. Among the factors considered will be:

- ❖ Overall GPA at SIUE
- GPA in Pre-CJ Program
- Current or previous employment in the criminal justice field
- Previous course work in criminal justice at other institutions
- Letters of recommendation from past or present instructors
- Other considerations that support the University's Long-Term Goal of Engaged Students and Capable Graduates

<u>Declaring a Criminal Justice Major</u>: To declare a major in Criminal Justice, it is necessary to have:

- Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
- 2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
- 3. Completed all General Education Skills courses with a grade of C or better in all courses;
- 4. Completed 15 hours of Breadth courses with a grade of C or better in all courses;
- 5. Completed SOC 111, POLS 112 and CJ 111or their equivalents with a grade of C or better in each course;
- 6. A grade point average of 2.75 or higher;
- 7. Completed the Pre-CJ Program (CJ 202, CJ 208, and one other 200 level CJ course); and
- 8. Written permission from the Director of the Criminal Justice Studies Program.
