Kimberly obtained her Bachelor's in Economics at Missouri State in 1995, and her Juris Doctorate at Saint Louis University in 2000.



#### **OBJECTIVES: 1 hr CEU**

She has participated in different projects funded by the private industry and the National Institutes of Health (NIH); these research efforts have resulted in several publications. She has been honored as a member of OKU Dental Honor Society, a fellow of the International College of Dentists, and fellow of American Dental Association-ADEA Leadership Institute. Dr. Garcia was the 2017 ADEA Enid Neidle Scholar. She was selected as a SIUE Phenomenal Woman 2020 for her contributions to inclusion, equity, and diversity.
