INTS 400 Internship in International Studies

Internship Application and Completion Information and Instructions

General Information

International Studies undergraduate majors may complete internships to earn both academic credit and valuable professional experience. Internships can provide a great opportunity to apply international studies theories and skills, as well as gain practical experience under the guidance of an organizational practitioner. Interns may work in any area of International Studies under the supervision of individuals from a variety of organizations with an international focus or pursuing projects in international contexts.

Requirements for International Studies Internships:

- Undergraduate student must be International Studies majors.
- Undergraduate student must have at least junior standing.
- Undergraduate student must have a minimum GPA of 2.5.
- Internships must be approved by the Director of the International Studies Program as well as a student's academic advisor before the student can receive internship credit.

Internship Application Process

For students, the Internship Application Process consists of the following three steps:

- (1) Locating and securing an appropriate internship;
- (2) Completing and submitting to program director an Internship Agreement; and
- (3) Registering for INTS 400 Internship in International Studies before semester deadlines.

Internship Completion Process

For students, the Internship Completion Process consists of the following three steps:

- (1) Completing and emailing to program director the Internship Summary;
- (2) Ensuring that internship supervisor completes and emails to program director the Final Evaluation of Student Intern; and
- (3) Receiving a grade for INTS 400 at the end of the semester.
