Exports are a Significant Portion of Illinois' Economy^A

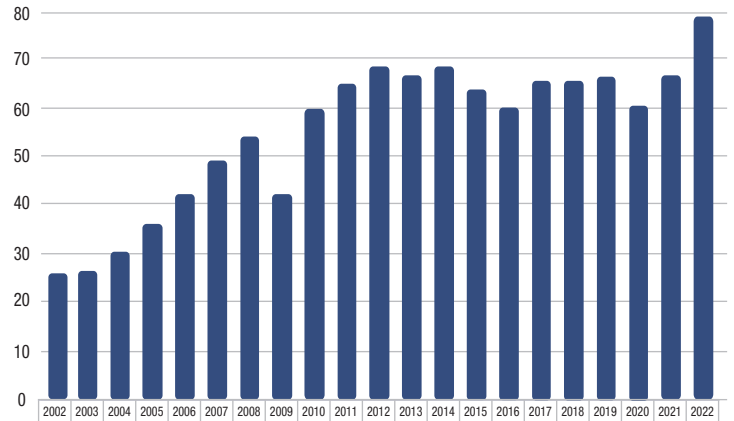
- Preliminary Illinois exports totaled over \$78.67 billion in 2022. The preliminary agricultural adjusted figure for 2022 is \$82.69 billion; **both All Time Highs.**^C
- Since 2009, Illinois exports have increased by \$37.05 billion, or 89.0%
- Illinois is the largest exporting state in the Midwest and the 5th largest in the nation, using agricultural adjusted figures provided by Census Bureau/USDA cash receipts.^C
- 19 out of top 20 export industries increased since 2021
- 19 out of top 20 export industries increased since 2009
- Top 10 Illinois export industries have seen gains since 2009
- 9 of the top 10 Illinois export partner countries have seen gains since 2009
- Export activities support over 800K jobs in Illinois.^B

Illinois' Export Growth Comes from Around the Globe

- 15 of Illinois' partner countries' markets are worth over a billion dollars in export value; a **new record**
- Canada was the largest single contributor to growth, with a \$5.18 Billion or 27.9% increase over 2021
- By percentage, Japan \$668.4 Million, (38.8%), Other notable growth markets include Mexico \$2.59 Billion (29.0%) and Australia \$1.03 Billion (29.3%) increase over 2021
- 9 of the top 10 Illinois export partner countries have seen gains since 2009

Illinois Exports a Diverse Range of Products

- Transportation Equipment was the single largest top 10 contributor to growth by gross amount, a \$2.09 Billion dollars and 31.4% increase over 2021
- Chemicals was the second largest contributor to growth with an \$1.81 Billion dollars and 12.8% increase over 2021
- 19 of top 20 industries recorded growth in 2021
- 19 of the top 20 industrial export industries have seen gains since 2009
- 14 Illinois export industries are valued at over \$1 billion dollars in total exports

Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in Illinois

- Over 2,634 firms that employ more than 380,500 people in Illinois^{D*}
- Illinois is ranked 2nd among all states and Chicago 1st among all metropolitan areas in locations for new and expanded corporate facilities (Site Selection Magazine, 2022)
- Chicago is the commercial capital of the U.S., with two of the top international exchanges (Chicago Board of Trade and Chicago Board Options Exchange)
- Chicago is the #1 container hub in the western hemisphere. Illinois' 13 port districts offer many companies direct links to the Atlantic Ocean, Great Lakes, and Gulf of Mexico
- O'Hare is among the world's busiest airports, served by all major international carriers and the only "dual hub" airport system in North America, handling over 1,949 flights per day with non-stop or direct global gateways to 64 international business capitals
- Foreign trade zones, located at eight sites across the state, offer low-cost production and warehousing facilities for import- and export-bound products
