BACKGROUND

- A healthcare needs assessment survey is a systematic approach to ensure a health service uses its resources to improve the health of its population in the most efficient way.
- The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) conducts a regular needs assessment survey of VA enrollees. However, these VA surveys do not capture the needs of over 9 million veterans ineligible to receive VA benefits, representing nearly half of all US veterans.

OBJECTIVE

 To capture the needs and attitudes towards pain, mental health and general healthcare services for all US military veterans and their children residing in Southern Illinois

METHODS

Study Design

Observational study that used a quantitative survey to collect information

Inclusion Criteria

 Respondents who are US military veterans who resided in Southern Illinois at the time of survey completion

Survey

- 59-question survey was conducted which contained survey items that assessed needs for and access to general health, pain and mental health services.
- · Display posters with links to the survey were sent to barbers, bars, churches, ministries, tattoo parlors, VFW halls and American Legion halls in addition to being posted on social media

Study Measures: Dependent Variables

Primary Outcome: identified potential gaps in access to health services and needs for Southern Illinois veterans and their dependent children

Study Measures: Independent Variables

 Age, race, marriage status, education level, county of residence, number of dependent children, prior branch of service, discharge status, current health insurance provider, service entry prior to 11 Sept 2001

Data Analysis

 Descriptive statistics including means, percentage, and standard deviations were used to describe sample population


CONCLUSIONS


- Access to general health and pain services were identified as key areas for improvement
- Provider mistrust could potentially limit use of mental health services
- High number of respondents with dependent children indicates pediatric healthcare should be considered a priority for veteran's health programs




Figure 1: Demographic Information

Respondent Pool's Distribution of Health Insurance Providers (N = 24)


